PORTOBELLO RESPONDS TO THE COST OF LIVING CRISIS

LIKE other parts of the country, people in Portobello are facing the spiralling cost of living. Everyone is feeling the squeeze on household budgets, with some seriously worried about how they will feed their families, heat their homes, and keep a roof over their heads in the months ahead. The Edinburgh City Council website www.edinburgh.gov.uk/costofliving – has comprehensive information on how people can get help, but local organisations are also providing support to people in need.

The nearest food bank for people in Portobello – called the Basics Bank – is at The Wilson Memorial Church on Moira Terrace, open every Tuesday from 10am-1pm. Clients are provided with fresh produce and cupboard staples, as well as a package of household and bathroom items, for up to six weeks, depending on individual circumstances. You need to be referred by local social services, such as a doctor or social worker, and your application is then assessed by the Edinburgh City Mission. The Baptist Church in Portobello takes donations for the Basics Bank. For more information see www. wilsonmemorial.org.uk.

Local churches are opening their doors to help people stay warm this autumn/winter, offering tea/coffee, Wi-Fi, books, games and friendly chat. The rota is Monday 10am-noon, Portobello and Joppa Parish Church; Tuesday 2-4pm, Portobello Baptist Church; Wednesday 10am-noon, St Mark's Episcopal Church and 2-4pm, Portobello Baptist Church; Thursday 2-4pm, Portobello Baptist Church. Friday 10am-12.30pm, Bellfield Community Hub. The Wash House, see page 6.

Always an inviting place during the cold months, Portobello Library is taking part in Edinburgh Council's 'Warm and Welcoming Places' winter initiative. A magazine swap box, colouring sheets and games will be available, with free hot drinks offered on Wednesdays from 6-7pm and Thursdays from 11am-12pm, even if you're not a library member.

The Portobello Citizens Advice Bureau in Bath Street can provide advice if you are struggling to make ends meet. At the moment there is no walk-in service, but the office is open Mondays and Thursdays, from 9.30am-4.30pm, to book an appointment, or you can phone for one (0131 510 5510). For more information see www. citizensadviceedinburgh.org.uk.

It's heartbreaking to have to give up your dog or cat because you're struggling financially and can't look after them properly. The Edinburgh Dog and Cat Home (EDCH) on Seafield Road East launched a pet food bank in 2019 for owners facing financial or personal crises. Not only food, but also pet accessories and bedding can be provided and staff are on hand to give advice or support. CHRIS COWIE

HAVING moved to Portobello when he was 12 years old, Chris Cowie has been living in the area for more than 50 years. In 1976,



he was Head Boy at Portobello High School, after which he trained as a primary school teacher at Jordanhill College in Glasgow. He spent seven years teaching in Craigmillar Primary School and another 29 years at Gracemount Primary School in Edinburgh's Southside. Since taking early retirement in 2016, Chris has spent much of his time contributing to the community in Portobello.

Chris says that he "wants to make a positive difference" and has taken on a number of projects which have improved the local area. He can regularly be found cleaning graffiti from the streets of Portobello and he is also an active member of Keep Porty Tidy. A passionate gardener, Chris has used his skills in a number of guerrilla gardening projects in the area. This involves tidying areas of land which have grown desolate, planting flowers and shrubs, and even installing benches. Three of Chris's notable projects can be found at the old Joppa Station on Brunstane Road, the police box and garden at the corner of Dalkeith Street and Morton Street, and near St John's Primary School on Duddingston Road.

Chris is an active committee member of the Joppa Community Tennis Courts and helps with maintenance of the courts, the new garden and the recently installed floodlights. His other pastimes include music and acting. He is a member of the Portobello and Joppa Church Drama Group and performed in its production of My Fair Lady.

Already planning future projects, Chris is currently looking for a local artist to collaborate with on a mural on the South Morton Street railway bridge. He has no plans to slow down, and wants to keep playing his part in improving things in the community.

Winter 2022 - 4 -



WINTER can be cold and miserable, which is a great excuse to dream and plan your garden. Seed catalogues are mines of information, but get your orders in early so you don't miss out. First to sow in January are chillies, sweet peas and broad beans, then in February sow tomatoes and start dahlias.

If the garden looks dreary, make a visit to a winter garden; the Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh is excellent. This will inspire you, as there are winter flowering plants, many you won't even know, but some are available, especially online. But please try to ensure they are British grown and peat-free for the sake of our soils and plant health.

Empty the compost heap and mulch the vegetable patch or special plants. Start to clear away any plants that are untidy and keep some for your own compost mix. Leave grasses and tall-stemmed plants that are dry for insects to overwinter in. Watch out for emerging bulbs and, as you see snowdrops emerging, lift some and put them in a pot for a cheery indoor display, which will last in a cool room for a week or two.

IT LOOKS like the world will exceed sooner than predicted, maybe by 2026, the 1.5 degree rise in temperature above preindustrial levels set by the Paris Agreement. As



this piece is being written, heads of government meet again at the COP27 climate conference but any promises made need to be backed up by investment to accelerate renewable power generation and better insulation of our buildings.

Major interventions are needed but we can individually contribute: turn down thermostats; only heat occupied spaces for a shorter time; walk and use public transport and reduce food waste.

At the Donkeyfield orchard we recently welcomed nursery age children from Calderglen to pick apples and taste juice. In October we held our Apple Day attended by over 70 adults and children. Watching the children make the connection between where the juice comes from and the wonderful taste of fresh apple juice was a sheer delight. Baked treats, toasted marshmallows and even sushi were eagerly consumed as were the bottles of Portobello Apple juice and chutney. Long may this continue but our leaders need to implement drastic changes now. Protest, write letters, change your behaviour, whatever – for our children's sake.

JOHN BRODIE'S PORTOBELLO ... PLUS A LITTLE MORE

THE latest history book from Archie Foley and Peter E Ross stems from a highly successful exhibition, Portobello in the 1950s and 1960s, held in Portobello Library in 2019, which featured photographs by local amateur photographer, John Brodie, who died in 1980. The book contains images from the exhibition, as well as some of his photos of other local neighbourhoods.

An introduction, by David McLean, tells the intriguing story of how he came into possession of Brodie's magnificent photographic collection, as well as giving a brief history of Brodie's life and time in Portobello. The 61 photographs, each with explanatory text, give a fascinating insight into outdoor life at that time and include many well-known local landmarks, including a poignant photo of Harry Lauder's birthplace in Bridge Street, taken in 1959, and a striking set of three of the fire at Portobello power station, taken in 1961.

The book is available from Portobello Library, Portobello Bookshop (and online) and Portobello Frame King.



THEN AND NOW...



WHILE it looks like a Greek temple and its western end is on its way to becoming a restaurant, Joppa Pumping Station has been sending sewage on its way to be processed since 1978. It is the last of seven stations, including Belhaven, North Berwick and Musselburgh, which pump sewage up the east coast to be processed at Seafield Waste Water Treatment Works.

It was the site of a popular, seawater paddling pool. The foundations of this can still be seen at low tide, as shown in this recent photograph. The pool provided lots of fun looking for small sea creatures, although care had to be taken with bare feet not to stand on sharp stones and shells. Pools of water left in the foundations, when the tide is out, can still be explored for crabs and other aquatic life. There is still a tidal paddling pool at North Berwick.



WHEN the plans for the community garden were drawn up they included the Coade stone pillars. In 2006 Portobello Amenity Society was awarded a Heritage Lottery Fund grant and, working with the City of Edinburgh Council and Portobello Community Council, successfully had the pillars erected on the site. The pillars had been stored by the council since 1989, after they were removed from the garden of Argyle House in Hope Lane. As a result, part of Portobello's history was preserved and the pillars provide a focal point for the garden, with many people admiring them and reading the information board.

Before this there was a paddling pool with seats and a grassy area on the site. The bottom of the pool could be slippery and care had to be taken. It was allowed to deteriorate over the years and became derelict. It was eventually dismantled. The paddling pool replaced the bandstand around 1960. The popular Edwardian bandstand also had a ballroom where people could dance to the music. This proved popular during World War Two when dances were organised for service personnel.

EDINBURGH DOG AND CAT HOME

EDINBURGH Dog and Cat Home will celebrate its 140th birthday in 2023. It has been on Seafield Road East for the past 57 years and not only provides a safe shelter for dogs and cats, but is part and parcel of life in Portobello and the wider city.

AMNESTY - LOCAL NEWS

IN A fractured world, there is no shortage of injustices for Amnesty International (AI) to campaign on internationally and its Portobello Group continues to do what it can to support this endeavour, not least through its Portobello Market stall, which continues to attract a heartening degree of interest.

The October market, despite fickle weather, garnered 169 signatures in a petition to the Saudi Arabian authorities to release academic and human rights campaigner Salma al-Shehab. He was sentenced to 34 years imprisonment on trumped up charges of "disturbing public order" – simply for using Twitter to support women's rights activists.

Signing a petition or writing a letter may seem a hopeless gesture. Yet AI can report numerous successful outcomes to its campaigns. Take, for instance, another Saudi campaigner, Nassima al-Sada, arrested in 2018 and jailed and beaten for peacefully defending human rights. Supporters worldwide sent 777,611 letters, tweets and e-mails to the authorities and Nassima walked free last year. Her son, Mousa al-Sada, believes that this international attention helped to finally bring about a verdict on the case following years of stagnation.

NEW COUNCIL BIN HUBS


THE City of Edinburgh Council has undertaken a review of communal bins to make it easier for people in flats to have the full range of recycling options, all situated in the same place. The new bins will have increased capacity, thus reducing overflowing bins and street clutter, and will be surrounded by railings to keep them secure. The Council carried out an online consultation in Portobello last summer and held a dropin session to gather feedback. Fifty-nine responses were received. The final bin hub locations have now been decided and can be found on www.edinburgh.gov.uk/ communalbinreview. No date has been set for the start of the work in Portobello, but residents will be sent postcards and Councillors informed in due course.

PARKING

IN THE past, communities Edinburgh across contacted the City of Edinburgh Council requesting action to tackle issues caused by non-residential parking. This led to a Strategic Review of Parking by the Transport and Environment Committee, initiated in 2018. Surveys of parking pressures were carried out in every street across the city, and 63 per cent of streets within the Portobello area were categorised as having 'high' parking pressures.

A public consultation on this issue was carried out in late 2021, via leafletting and an online survey. A subsequent report will be considered in December. If the decision is to proceed with proposals for parking controls in Portobello, a full statutory public consultation will be required as part of the formal Traffic Order process.
